SUBJECT: Status Report of Pending Litigation

This report lists the pending litigation cases involving the City, with the exception of worker's compensation claims, which are handled by risk management; municipal information; and uniform traffic citations issued for red light camera violations enforced by the Hallandale Beach Police Department.

Closed Cases since Last Status Report

1. John Motes and Shirley Motes v. City of Hallandale Beach (Judge John J. Murphy III)

On June 26, 2012, Plaintiffs filed its action alleging negligence on the part of the City as a result of a car accident involving Police Officer Anthony Distefano. Plaintiffs claim to have suffered personal injuries and a loss of consortium as a result of the accident. The City filed an answer and affirmative defenses denying negligence. The City also filed a Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff's consortium claim. On August 22, 2012, Plaintiffs filed a Voluntary Dismissal as to the consortium claim. The parties were able to settle the case for \$14,500.00. The case is over.

State Court Cases

1. Valeriy Bogatov as father and Representative of Alex Bogatov v. City of Hallandale Beach (Judge Carol Lisa Phillips)

On June 29, 2012, Plaintiff filed its action alleging negligence on the part of the City as a result of his son Alex Bogatov allegedly having fallen from the play structure at South Beach Park. The City filed a Motion to Dismiss the complaint and a Motion for Protective order as to video depositions of the Mayor and Vice Mayor. On September 11, 2012, the Court denied the motion to dismiss without prejudice and granted the protective order. The City filed its answer and affirmative defenses. The City filed a Motion to Dismiss Complaint, and the hearing is scheduled for June 22, 2015. Discovery and depositions are in progress. Trial is scheduled to commence June 29, 2015.

2. Agostino Bellico and Rose Bellico v. City of Hallandale Beach (Judge Mily R. Powell)-DOI 3/11/2013

On February 27, 2015, Plaintiff filed its action alleging that on March 11, 2013, Plaintiff sustained severe permanent injuries when he tripped and fell due to a dangerous condition involving an uneven, broken, depressed walking surface on the sidewalk located at 1301 N.E. 7th Street, in Hallandale Beach. Plaintiff alleged injuries his foot falling forward landing and injuring his right elbow, shoulder, chin breaking his bridge. Mr. Bellico had surgery on his right shoulder. Discovery ongoing.

3. Miguel Charun v. City of Hallandale Beach (Judge Marina Garcia-Wood) – DOI – 5/30/12

On September 24, 2013, Plaintiff filed suit against the City alleging that on May 30, 2012, that City employee Kevin Herbert, negligently operated a City vehicle to cause a collision with Plaintiff's vehicle causing bodily injury and resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish, loss of capacity for the enjoyment of life, hospital expenses, and loss of earning. The City filed its answer and affirmative defenses to the complaint. Discovery and depositions are in progress.

4. Jossica Devis v. City of Hallandale Beach – (Judge Dale Ross)

On April 24, 2012, Plaintiff filed suit against the City alleging that on February 2, 2011, at the intersection of NW 2nd Avenue and NW 2nd Street, Officer Frederick Allen Sanks carelessly and negligently operated a City vehicle so to cause a collision with the Plaintiff's vehicle causing serious and permanent bodily injuries and resulting pain and suffering disability and disfigurement, mental anguish, hospital expenses, and loss of the ability to earn money. The City filed its answer and affirmative defenses to the

complaint. Discovery and depositions continue.

5. Angela Herrera v. Transfield Services Infrastructure, Inc., VMS Maintenance Systems, Inc., FDOT, VMS, Inc., f/k/a Maintenance Systems, Inc., and City of Hallandale Beach (Judge William Haury) DOI 12/24/09

On August 18, 2014, the City was served with Plaintiff's complaint alleging that on December 24, 2009, sustained severe permanent injuries when she tripped and fell due to a dangerous condition involving an uneven, broken, depressed walking surface on the sidewalk of located on State Road A1A of South Ocean Drive, in Hallandale Beach. The City filed its Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff's complaint. Discovery and depositions continue.

6. Irwin Knohl v. FDOT and City of Hallandale Beach (Judge Bowman) DOI-7/14/12

On July 18, 2014, the City was served with Plaintiff's complaint alleging that on July 14, 2012, tripped and fell forcefully to the ground on the sidewalk of A1A/South Ocean Drive, suffering grievous bodily injury including multiple fractures, permanent injury, aggravation of pro-existing injury, pain and suffering, impairment, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish, medical and loss of capacity for the enjoyment of life. The City filed its answer and affirmative defenses to the complaint. Discovery and depositions continue. Trial for this case is scheduled to commence November 2, 2015.

7. Marie Horvath and Levente Horvath v. City of Hallandale Beach (Judge John Luzzo) DOI-10/30/2013

On April 15, 2015, Police Officer Jaime Cerna was served with Plaintiff's complaint for injuries sustained in an automobile accident in Officer Cerna individual capacity, however, Officer Cerna was dismissed from the complaint. Plaintiff amended its complaint on April 15, 2015 alleging negligence on the part of the City as a result of a car accident involving Officer Jaime Cerna. Plaintiff's alleged injuries includes bodily injury and resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish, loss of ability to earn money, loss of capacity for the enjoyment of life, and medical expenses. Discovery ongoing.

8. Madelyne Lazarus v. City of Hallandale Beach, American Traffic Solutions, LLC, and ATS American Traffic Solutions, Inc. (Judge Cynthia Imperato) DOI – 12/6/09

On August 10, 2010, the City was served with Plaintiffs uncertified class action complaint for damages, declaratory, and injunctive relief against the City of Hallandale Beach and American Traffic Solutions (ATS). Plaintiff's complaint arises out of the City's Ordinance base red light program. The complaint alleges that the City's program

is an invalid exercise of municipal power and that the City is otherwise preempted by the State legislature in this area of law. Although, the City Commission approved Plaintiff's settlement offer of up to thirty (30%) percent of the funds received from ordinance base program. . The Florida Supreme Court has recently stricken the ordinance in Aventura and Orlando as unconstitutional. Counsel for the City of Aventura has requested a rehearing for clarification. It is unclear whether or not everyone who received a red light ticket is required to be refunded or just those that contested the ticket and were required to pay. We are waiting for the court's decision.

9. Phillip Mcenany, et al v. Ronald Beukers – (Judge Milly Rodriguez-Powell) DOI – 7/7/11

On October 6, 2011, Officer Beukers was served with Plaintiff's complaint for negligence. Plaintiff alleges Sgt. Beukers negligently struck Plaintiff causing personal injuries. At the time of the accident, Sgt. Beukers was driving a city owned take home vehicle. Sgt. Beukers is represented by counsel provided by his rider insurance carrier. On April 10, 2012, the City was served with Plaintiff's amended complaint. The City has filed its answer and affirmative defenses, a Motion to strike Count II of Plaintiffs' amended Complaint, and Motion to Dismiss Count IV of Plaintiffs' amended complaint. The City's Motion to Dismiss Count IV of the amended complaint was granted on July 23, 2012. On November 25, 2013, Plaintiff filed a motion for leave to amend to file a 3rd amended complaint, which the City opposed. On December 17, 2013, the Court granted the Plaintiff's motion to file a 3rd amended complaint. The City has filed its answer and affirmative defenses. Discovery and depositions continue. On May 4, 2015, Plaintiff's counsel filed a Motion to Withdraw as counsel, and the Court granted the Motion. Trial has been continued to allow Plaintiff's to retain new counsel.

10. Debra Molina v. City of Hallandale Beach – (Judge Michael Gates) DOI – 1/28/2013

On March 16, 2015, Plaintiff filed its action against the City alleging the she sustained injuries to her foot, and causing swelling and bruising to her right hand when she fell through a hollow portion of land that gave way causing her to fall in a hole. The City was installing a water main in the location of NE 1st Street & NE 8th Avenue at the time. Discovery and deposition continue.

11. Christina Sam Niego, as Personal Representative of the Estate of Eduardo Prieto, Deceased v. Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., Broward Sheriff's Office, Hallandale Beach Police Department, and Broward County (Judge John Bowman) – DOI 9/6/2012

On November 17, 2014, Plaintiff filed its action against the Hallandale Police Department alleging the wrongful death due to negligence due to the subsequent actions on September 6, 2012, which cause the death of Eduardo Prieto, Jr. The City filed a limited appearance to respond to Plaintiff's complaint, by filing a Motion to Dismiss

stating that the Hallandale Police Department is not its own entity. On November 20, 2014, Plaintiff filed its Notice of Voluntary Dismissal without Prejudice as against the Hallandale Beach Police Department. On November 25, 2014, the Plaintiff filed a Motion for Leave to file Second Amended Complaint by adding the City of Hallandale Beach. On January 12, 2015, Plaintiff filed a Motion for Leave to file Third Amended Complaint, and the hearing was scheduled for June 4, 2015. The City has not been served with Plaintiff complaint to date.

12. Gabriel Tamarez v. City of Hallandale Beach and the School Board of Broward County (Judge Marina Garcia-Wood)

On September 26, 2012, Plaintiff filed its action against the City and the Broward County School Board alleging negligence as a result of personal injuries sustained during a football practice at Peter Bluestein Park. It is alleged that Plaintiff ran into bleachers that were in the middle of the field. On September 25, 2012, the City filed an answer and affirmative defense denying negligence. Plaintiff has since been deposed. Discovery and depositions continue.

13. Robert Tartaglia v. City of Hallandale Beach – (Judge Marina Garcia-Wood) – DOI 5/23/11

On July 25, 2014, the City was served with the complaint alleging that on May 23, 2011, that the Police Department K-9 Tobar assaulted and battered the Plaintiff causing bodily injury and resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish. The Plaintiff and his girlfriend got into a physical altercation, the girlfriend demanded that Plaintiff leave her residence, but he refused. Plaintiff's girlfriend called the police for assistance, and when police arrived, the Plaintiff was asleep on the couch. The Plaintiff was given verbal warnings to get up and leave his girlfriend's residence, but did not comply, and the Police K-9, Tobar was released. The City filed its Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff complaint. The Parties agreed to an order dismissing the case. The Plaintiff has agreed to dismiss the officer and amend the complaint. The Plaintiff has not filed an amended complaint and we are unsure whether or not they will. The City will have thirty (30) days to file its response.

14. Rod Tony v. City of Hallandale Beach – (Judge John Bowman) – DOI 2/3/2012

On August 5, 2013, Plaintiff filed its suit against the City alleging that on February 3, 2012, that City employee Juan Lewis, negligently operated a City vehicle to cause a collision with Plaintiff's vehicle causing bodily injury and resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish, loss of capacity for the enjoyment of life, hospital expenses, and loss of earning. The City filed its answer and affirmative defenses to the complaint. Discovery and depositions continue. Trial has been set to begin October 2015.

15. City of Hallandale Beach v. Josue Hernandez, and Broward County Police Benevolent Association (Appellate Division)

On April 13, 2015, the City filed action for declaratory judgment and supplemental relief pursuant to Chapter 86 of the Florida Statutes. The City is in doubt as to its ability to expend public funds to pay attorney fees assessed solely against an individual employee and its statutory responsibilities in connection with Florida Statute 111.071, Payment of judgments or settlements against certain public officers or employees and attorney fees assessed against one of its police department employees.

Appellate Cases

16. Golden Horn Condominium Association, Inc. v. City of Hallandale Beach – (Appellate Division)

This appeal stems from a violation of the Florida Fire Prevention Code. The violation occurred at the Golden Horn Condominium located at 437 Golden Isles Drive, Hallandale Beach. The source of the violation is the condominium's fire alarm panel. Specifically, work was conducted on the fire alarm panel without securing the proper City permits.

17. TS&B, III, LLC v. City of Hallandale Beach (Appellate Division)

On December 17, 2014, Petitioner filed a Petition for Writ of Certiorari, by challenging the City's approval of the Regional Agency Center (RAC), and the notice to the Petitioner. The Writ of Cert appeal is filed in an abundance of caution to avoid a potential jurisdictional trap.

18. TS&B, III, LLC v. City of Hallandale Beach (Appellate Division)

On December 17, 2014, Petitioner filed Complaint for Declaratory Judgment and Injunctive Relief alleging that the three (3) ordinance passed on November 5, 2014 are inconsistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan, and seeks to enjoin the change in zoning as it applies to the Petitioner's subject property.

19. Eastwood Mobile Home Park, Inc. v. City of Hallandale Beach (Appellate Division)

On December 5, 2014, Petitioner filed its Motion to Stay Proceedings Pending Resolution of Local Administrative and Statutory Dispute Resolution Process, petitioning the Court to issue a writ of certiorari directed at the City Commissioners of Hallandale Beach, quashing Ordinance Numbers 2014-31, 2014-31, and 2014-32, all adopted on November 5, 2014.
